CURRICULUM



NURSERY

Mayoor Nursery is built on the principle of giving all children the best possible start in life, encouraging confidence and independence. We follow the Early Years Foundation Stages (EYFS) curriculum that focuses on 7-core areas of age-appropriate learning in addition to the Emergent Curriculum.



KINDERGARTEN

We follow the Indian CBSE Curriculum enhanced with 21st Century skills based learning activities from Kindergarten onwards.

This includes Literacy, Numeracy, Communication and Language, Art and Craft, Music and General Knowledge.



PRIMARY

We aim at promoting Holistic growth of each student. Emphasizing on: Intellectual, Personal, Emotional & Social growth through all domains of Knowledge.

Subjects include English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Second Language, Music, Art and Craft and Physical Education.



SECONDARY & SENIOR SECONDARY

Education at Mayoor in this phase focuses on the students that are able to think scientifically, mathematically or artistically to face the real-life challenges in an information and technology driven world.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

In line with the latest ADEK guidelines, parents have to submit the Student Absentee Form if their child is absent on any school day.

The form must be submitted before 8:00 AM on the day of the absence, mentioning the proper reason for absence. Failure to submit the form within the given timeframe will result in your child being marked as Unexcused Absence for that day.

We would like to inform you that we have automated attendance messages in our system for students with 'Unexcused Absences'. Based on the number of unexcused absences that the student has accumulated in attendance, these messages will be sent automatically to parents via SMS and email.

Please note that after 3 days of unexcused absence ADEK will start sending the Absence Notifications at below intervals :

- 3 days of unexcused absence.
- 6 days of unexcused absence.
- 8 days of unexcused absence.

After 10 Days of unexcused absence your case will be automatically referred to ADEK.

ADEK will closely monitor, and further actions may be taken if the absenteeism continues.

Notification of Further Action:

You will receive the message from ADEK indicating that the relevant authority will contact the parent to discuss the consequences of continued unexcused absences of 18-19 days.

Consequences and Final Action:

After 20 days, the message from ADEK will inform parents that the relevant authority will take action and contact them to discuss the consequences of non-compliance with school attendance policies. As per the ADEK attendance policy, leave of more than 21 days in an academic year can lead to retaining students in the same grade for the next academic year.

TRANSPORTATION



School Bus

Our buses operate for your safety and convenience with an integrated RFID Card system.

1. The same expectations and responsibilities that apply at school apply to time spent waiting for and riding on the bus.
2. Similarly, disciplinary concerns relating to the buses are handled as they would be, if they happened at school.
3. Be on time for the bus.
4. Wait at designated stops and off roadways for the bus.
5. Board the bus by taking turns.
6. Take a seat immediately once you have boarded the bus.
7. Use a seat belt once seated.
8. Be courteous at all times to the driver, bus nanny, your MPS peers and all passersby outside of the bus.
9. When exiting the bus at your dropoff point, be safety conscious about the traffic.
10. Before getting down from the bus, please check your belongings.
11. If your child is not returning on the bus, for any reason, in the afternoon, it is necessary that parents contact to Transport Supervisor

In case of change of residence, parents are to consult the respected supervisor and bus supervisor in advance.

Own Transport

Morning Drop-off:

Parking:

1. All parents must park their vehicles exclusively in the designated Visitor Parking areas.
2. Staff parking is reserved for school staff only.
3. Park vehicles in the designated parking slots.

Drop-off Procedure:

1. Drop off students directly at the reception.
2. For the safety of our children, please do not leave them unattended in the parking lot.
3. Dropping children off alone in the parking area is strictly prohibited.
4. All students using their own transportation must be dropped off before 7:55 am to ensure they can reach the morning assembly on time.

Afternoon Pick-up:

1. Students using their own transportation must assemble in the designated classroom at 2:40 pm.
2. Pick-up Time: 2:40 pm - 2:45 pm

Procedure:

- Park your vehicle in the designated parking area.
- Proceed to the main gate security and present your parent pass to gain access to the reception area.
- Upon arrival at the reception, inform the security of your child's name.
- Reception will safely hand over your child to you.

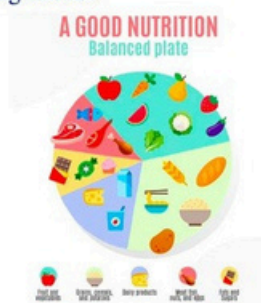

We promote nutritious eating, food safety, and sustainable habits to support student health and wellbeing.

All food consumed on campus follows **ADG2, ADEK, QCC (Quality & Conformity Council) and UAE food safety regulations.**

Foods and drinks listed on the ADG2 *Red List* (including sugary drinks, junk food, pork products, and restricted allergens) are **strictly prohibited.**
- 4. 🍽️ Balanced Meals – MyPlate Model**
Lunch must include a healthy balance of **protein, grains, fruits, and vegetables** as per ADG2 “MyPlate” standards.
- 5. 🍎 Healthy Snacks Only**
Low-sugar and low-fat snacks are allowed at **breakfast or snack time only.** Desserts are not permitted at lunch.
- 6. 💧 Hydration First**
Water is the **default and encouraged drink** at all times. Clean drinking water is available throughout the school day.
- 7. 🚫🥤 No Sugary Drinks**
Carbonated drinks, flavored beverages, and energy drinks are **not allowed** on campus or during events.
- 8. 🙅🍌 Allergy Safety & Inclusion**
We strictly protect students with food allergies and dietary needs through labeling, monitoring, and emergency protocols.
- 9. 🍖 Non-Halal Food Rules**
Non-halal meat may be brought **only for personal consumption** by non-Muslim students and **must not be shared.**
- 10. 🚫🍷 Limited Food Sharing**
Food sharing is discouraged. If approved, it requires **parent consent, ADG2 compliance, and strict hygiene controls.**
- 11. 🎂🍷 Healthy Celebrations**
We encourage **non-food celebrations** such as certificates, games, or recognition **instead of sweets.** Chocolates and sweets are not allowed on birthdays. Students may donate plants

to the school instead.

12. 🌸 **Hand Hygiene is Mandatory**

All students must **wash or sanitize hands before eating**. Staff supervise and support younger children.

13. 🍱 **Lunchbox Checks**

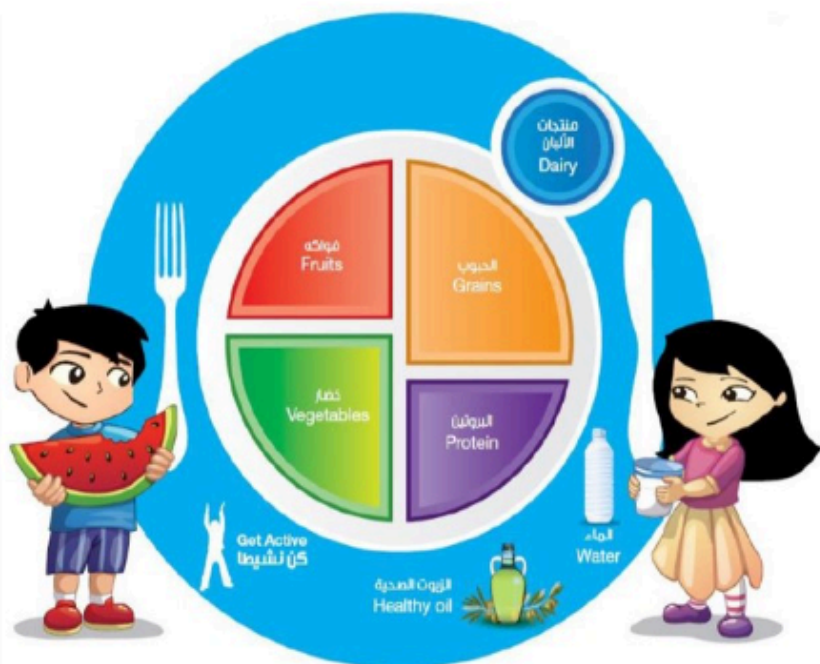
Lunchboxes are checked respectfully for compliance. Parents are informed the **same day** if items are not allowed.

RESTRICTED FOODS & BEVERAGES (RED LIST)

As per Abu Dhabi Guidelines School Food & Nutrition Requirements

-  **Deep-Fried Foods**
All deep-fried items (e.g. fries, samosas, falafel, fried chicken) are **prohibited** due to high saturated/trans fat and calorie content.
-  **High-Sugar & High-Fat Sweets**
Cakes, donuts, pastries, candy, marshmallows, ice cream, slushies, and chocolate with less than 50% cocoa are **not permitted**.
-  **Soft Drinks & Fizzy Beverages**
All regular, diet, and zero-calorie carbonated drinks are **restricted** due to high sweetener content and lack of nutritional value.
-  **Energy, Sports & Caffeinated Drinks**
Energy drinks, sports drinks, coffee, and caffeinated teas are **not allowed** for students, except isotonic drinks under approved conditions for athletes.
-  **Fruit Syrup & Sweetened Juices**
Juice drinks labeled “cocktail,” “beverage,” or “made from fruit” are **restricted**. Only 100% fruit juice (max 200 ml, no added sugar) is permitted.
-  **Processed & High-Fat Meats**
Processed meats (hotdogs, sausages, salami, bacon, mortadella, smoked meats) and high-fat meat cuts are **prohibited**.
-  **Non-Halal & Alcohol-Containing Foods**
All pork products, pork derivatives, and foods containing alcohol (ethanol) are **strictly prohibited** on school premises.
-  **Foods with Artificial Additives**
Foods containing artificial colours, flavours, MSG, high fructose corn syrup, or non-approved sweeteners are **not permitted**.
-  **Sweetened Dairy, Soy & Imitation Products**
Flavoured dairy drinks, imitation cheeses, and highly processed soy products exceeding sugar/fat thresholds are **restricted**.
-  **High-Salt Foods, Sauces & Allergens**
Pickled foods, high-calorie sauces (mayonnaise, ketchup, creamy dressings), and high-risk allergens (nuts, sesame, soy) are **restricted** to ensure student safety.

ANTI SMOKING/ ANTI TOBACCO POLICY

In line with Federal Law No. (15) of 2009 on combating smoking , Mayoor Private School aims to provide a safe working and learning environment for both students and staff. The whole school supports the anti-smoking policy which aligns to the other policies of the school such as Health and Safety policy and Behavior Policy.

The Smoke-Free Environment

Smoking is not permitted in any part of the school site including the parking area at any time. This includes all school buildings and the outside areas of the school including playgrounds, sports fields. Smoking by anyone on a school visit or trip is not permitted. Smoking at the entrances and exits to the school site will not be permitted.

Disciplinary Action

The day to day implementation of this policy is the responsibility of the whole school community and everybody has a duty to respond to breaches of the policy. Any person who smokes on the premises will be asked to extinguish the offending item and/or leave the premises. Staff or students who breach the no smoking policy will be advised that this could result in disciplinary action.



SCHOOL BAG POLICY

Purpose



Mayoor School supports and encourages a safe and healthy lifestyle for all. The weight of the School Bag is part of the physical well being of the students, hence it is the responsibility of all the stakeholders to be actively involved in making sure that the student does not carry a heavy School Bag.

Aims



1. To reduce weight of the School Bag
2. To promote Health and Safety
3. To avoid long term effects of heavy school bags
4. Compliance with ADEK Policy

Guidelines



1. Parents should check the bag of students before they depart for school in the morning and remove all unnecessary things.
2. School will conduct an awareness program at the beginning of every session regarding the weight of the bag and the health hazard of carrying overweight.
3. Teachers will conduct random checks.
4. Home assignments will be flexible by the way of worksheets, soft copies and educational apps like IXL, Raz Kids, etc.
5. Students are advised to buy ergonomic school bags with padded and adjustable straps.
6. The school bag weight should not exceed 20% of the student's body weight.

PARENTAL CONTRACT

Introduction:

Enrollment and Re- enrollment:

- The enrollment, re-enrolment and continuity of my child(ren) for the academic year depends on my agreement with and following of the preceding rules.

Communication with school:

- I will communicate regularly with my child's teachers. I will respond to any phone call or email from any member of the school. My conversation will be polite with any staff in the school.
- If I am asked to attend a meeting at the school regarding my child's education or behavior, I will make every effort to be there on time.
- If I have any concern or questions, I will communicate in a respectful manner with school staff.
- Any change of my/our address, telephone/mobile number, email address shall be immediately notified to the school in writing.
- Any changes to the students particulars shall be notified in writing as soon as possible to the school. I have disclosed all relevant medical and health data about the pupil in the medical record submitted to the school and will keep the school informed of any changes to the information provided therein.
- All communications with the school may be monitored or recorded for quality assurance and training purposes. I am aware that I will receive a communication back from the school, depending on the concern addressed in my email, either in form of a phone call an email within two business days. I will follow the school's communication guidelines and hierarchy.

Attendance:

- I understand that each school day is important, and I will make sure that my child attends school on time, every day. (before 7.45 am.)
- I will not permit my child to be absent from school for unauthorized reasons. I understand the difference between authorized and unauthorized absences.
- I am also aware of the school attendance rules as per ADEK requirements and will abide by it.
